HERE ARE A FEW OF THE THINGS WE HEARD FROM YOU!

In 5-10 years what does success look like in the area of Community & Youth for Tseshaht?

- Task force addressing alcohol and drugs & a place close by where people can go for help (healing center)
- Strong communication with youth/re-invigorate Youth Council: hearing directly from youth, bigger youth events
- Having our members employed = success
- Personal assessments – where do I go afterschool – who am I?
- Workshops to encourage self reflection & pulling out strength in youth/members
- Foods – incorporate families, elders, (cultural value) and Tseshaht work ethic, respectful, functioning as a community first.
- Community trips to BGI – to learn
- Harvesting opportunities for our members to learn
- We need to show our young people and talk to them about change
- More spaces for Youth & the gym always open – more volunteers to work with youth
- Creating monthly or even every 3-month community dinners for Tseshaht.

- Showcasing our Tseshaht Culture
- Partnering with existing activities
- Fish sales to tourists
- Sproat school building used: small businesses, office spaces, store fronts,

When: Saturday April 8th, 2017 after 3:30pm

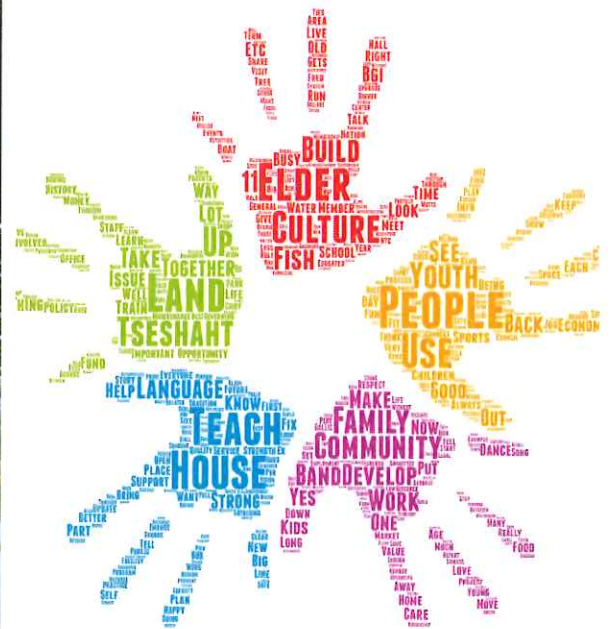
Requirements: Must have experience with Tsessaht Facilities' clean-up standards and be able to meet these standards.

The Tseshah First Nation (TFN) is now accepting applications for a six (6) month term contract placement of a qualified senior manager to oversee the general operations of its Administration Office. This position reports to the TFN Council with a mandate to fulfill the leadership responsibilities of the role of the TFN Administration Office's senior administrator in an "acting" capacity. This position is being offered to fill in for a short term medical leave.

The (Acting) Executive Director will be accountable to oversee the staff, programs and services associated with the general office and community service departments, including: Office Services, Public Works, Housing, Social Development, Community Health, Education, Membership Services, Daycare, Youth and Recreation. This interim position will provide leadership for the completion of Fiscal Year projects and will review, assess and develop management plans to address identified priorities for strategic plans, policies and protocols.

Ensuring a professional approach is in place for the management of staff, service delivery and for the development and implementation of plans, programs and policies, this position leads by example and promotes a team approach for the achievement of objectives.

Note: continuation of this interim position will be subject to an organizational review

- Well-developed negotiation and mentoring/coaching skills. Proven analytical skills, for interpretation, problem solving and decision making.
- Well-developed written and verbal communication skills, demonstrated ability to administer confidential matters with integrity and professionalism.
