
LANGUAGE GATHERING

As you may recall, Melissa and Tamara headed to San Francisco at the beginning of February to attend the Facebook Communities Summit at Facebook Headquarters in Menlo Park.

Melissa and Tamara were two of the 400 attendees that were handpicked by Facebook out of thousands of applicants from all over Canada, the United States, and Mexico.





The event started late afternoon with registration on Wednesday, February 6, 2019 followed by an informal evening that provided an opportunity for all attendees to meet each other and check out the Facebook Headquarters Campus. "We were treated to an open air patio area with food and beverage stations, fire bowl tables, games, a tarot card reader and blankets to keep us entertained, fed and

warm," shared Melissa.



NA ŠUK T'AŠII - STRONG PATH 2019 GRADUATES



Over the last few months Richard Sam, Gina Pearson and Gail K Gus have been a part of **Na šuk t'ašii** training program. The program was fully funded through FNHA and translates as "Strong Path". It is based on culturally relevant Harm Reduction, and they gained information on the opiate overdose crisis and addiction and how First Nations view and understand it.

Trauma Sensitivity Training and Cultural Immersion
Training was completed, followed by First Aid
Training and a refresher on Naloxone administration.
Gail said, "best of all we learned our first Chant and made

a rattle which can be used to bring people up the mountain to be brushed off for our cultural toolkits."

"Gina, Myself and Richard have also taken the Community Wellness course so now I have a stronger team, should there be a crisis in the community, I will have some help", stated Gail.







TSESHAHT CHIEF COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

PROTOCOL AGREEMENTS

Protocol agreements were signed in 2019:



Port Alberni Port Authority – January 30, 2019 City of Port Alberni – February 6, 2019

TSESHAHT PRESENCE AT HARBOUR QUAY

Our council and staff have been working closely with representatives of the City of Port Alberni to have a stronger presence at Harbour Quay. We signed a Memorandum of Understanding in 2018 and have since been working on art and signage to display Tseshaht history at Harbour Quay while work is being done to upgrade the clock tower. This work is expected to be completed in time for the first cruise ship landing in May 2019. An unveiling event/ceremony will be planned.

Our local Rotary Club was successful in obtaining a grant to do a mural on the side of the CME building located at the Harbour Quay. A call for proposals has been put out and this project is expected to be completed by June 2019. Tseshaht has been invited to take part in this process. The committee is hoping that this art piece can reflect local history as well as reconciliation efforts.

CSC ABORIGINAL HEALING LODGE

Tseshaht First Nation was invited to participate in a meeting about potentially opening up an Aboriginal Healing Lodge in Port Alberni. On January 11th many

members of the community from a number of different organizations attended an exploratory meeting with Correctional Services Canada. This initiative was started in 2010 with no success and recently resurrected to see if Aboriginal Groups would be interested in pursuing this any further. At this time, it is unclear if any group will be taking the lead and if an

Aboriginal Healing Lodge is suitable for this area, considering a majority of charges in Port Alberni are Provincial, and this healing lodge would be limited to Federal offenders.

BC GAMING REVENUE SHARING WITH FIRST NATIONS

After many years of lobbying, the Province of British Columbia has finally announced BC Gaming Revenue Sharing with First Nations. This has been included in the 2019/2020 Budget and work is currently being done to establish a BC First Nations Gaming Revenue Sharing Limited Partnership (expected to be operational by April 2019). 7% of Gaming revenue will be shared with 203 First Nations in British Columbia. Over a 25-year agreement this is estimated to bring approximately \$3 billion to First Nations in BC, distributed based on the following formula (50% distributed equally, 40% split based on population, 10% based Nation's split

remoteness). The funding may be spent in the following areas; (1) health and wellness, (2) transportation, safety, infrastructure and housing, (3) education, language, culture and training, (4) community development and environmental protection, (5) economic and business development and (6) capacity building, governance and fiscal management. Priority exercises will be done with Community, Council and Administration to engage on how this funding should be spent. Revenue sharing with First Nations was the first phase of work the next phase will be to create more gaming opportunities for First Nations in BC.

KWISPAA LNG

On February 15, 2019 Huu-ay-aht First Nation announced that Steelhead LNG ceased work on the Kwispaa LNG project. Hugh Braker is the council member that holds this portfolio and will provide more information to the community.

2017 AGM CONTINUATION

On February 9, 2019 we held the continuation of the 2017 AGM to discuss the three agenda items that were not completed. This included; Lateral Violence, Chief and Council, and Facility Use. The AGM continuation was facilitated by Ainjil Hunt and was well attended by community members. For lateral violence we will be scheduling "lateral kindness" workshops in the community for staff, council, community and as a collective. It was also noted that a dispute

resolution process needs to be in place. A number of concerns were put forward and many can be addressed in the work currently being done on the Custom Election Code, policy and procedures manual and governance manual. The facility use policy is also currently being worked on and expected to be completed in the near future. Thank you to everyone that took the time to participate in these discussions!

TSESHAHT AGM

We are truly grateful for the amount of community members that took the time to attend our Annual General Assembly on February 10, 2019. We had a high number of participants attend and contribute to a great day of discussions and presentations. Due to the snow a motion was made to adjourn earlier and reschedule to complete the work between March 6-21, 2019. On February 10th we were able to complete the Council reports, business relating to

the Ahousaht Fisheries Case, hear concerns about the Administration Land brought forward by the Fred family and honour the work of Andy Olson. Agenda items that we will need to discuss at the continuation include; administrative updates by the Executive Director, community meetings and engagement, mission and vision statement, and a wish list exercise. Provided is a table which highlights a number of projects that each council member is working on.



Thank you to all staff, council and community members for making this day a huge success! The discussions, decisions, songs, dances, stories, and everything else was greatly appreciated.

TSESHAHT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT CORPORATE STRUCTURE

On February 24, 2019 our council and staff members met with Ratcliff and Company regarding options for Tseshaht Corporate Structure. This work is only in the beginning stages and we will ensure we engage community on this very important work!

NTC BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Budget Meetings - request to have a decision to keep budget meetings the same and have an annual budget meeting with all NTC Society members or to have the annual budget meeting changed to require only a decision from the NTC Directors. Some of the concerns I shared included the lack of time provided to consult with council on recommended motions presented at NTC directors meetings such as the motion provided. I also encouraged that if the table decided to go with the second option that we receive all budget information and documents two weeks in advance to review internally before the budget meeting for Directors. I also requested that each nation invite their Director of Finance to attend the meeting

to provide input. A motion was passed to go with option 2- I opposed the vote. The budget presentation will be scheduled during the March 26, 2019 NTC Board of Directors Meeting.

After months of inviting the First Nations Housing and Infrastructure Council to engage with the Nuuchah-nulth Nations a representative attended the February 26, 2019 NTC Board of Directors Meeting to answer questions. It is still unclear on the mandate of the council as well as many other implications this may have on our Housing and Infrastructure programs. There will be a Forum in Richmond on March 5-6 as well as more engagement with Nuu-chahnulth Nations tentatively scheduled for March 25,

2019. After these engagement forums we are hoping to have a better understanding of the work of the First Nations Housing and Infrastructure and the work being done across Canada to restructure

Housing and Infrastructure for First Nations. Greg Louie (Ahousaht) was also appointed to the FNHIC by the FNHIC.

TSESHAHT COUNCIL MEETS WITH HEREDITARY LEADERS

On February 23, 2019 members of Tseshaht Council met informally with two of our hereditary leaders. The purpose of this meeting was to ensure we have open communication with our hereditary leaders on the work we are doing as Council. We also wanted to explore the opportunity to build a stronger relationship and to ensure we follow the

protocols/processes set out by our leaders to engage on important work/projects and that we have a unified voice as Tseshaht on important matters. We are currently looking to set up regular meetings with our hereditary leaders to ensure information sharing on the work we do as Council.

OTHER ITEMS...

Tseshaht Women's Declaration – a meeting to continue this work needs to be rescheduled.

Reports – We as council have heard the community that more regular reporting is needed on the work we are doing. As a council we have committed to monthly written Chief Councillor report and quarterly written

reports by all council members to community.

Council Cooks for the Community – this was a huge success in December 2018 and many community and council members would like to see this continue! Stay tuned for an upcoming schedule of when we as council will cook for community!

Best of luck to all of our youth participating in the upcoming **Junior All Native Tournament** in Kitimat this year! Safe travels to all and thank you to everyone that makes this opportunity possible for our youth!
