### Background:

On June 26, 2014, the Supreme Court of Canada unanimously declared that the Tsilhqot'in Nation have Aboriginal title to approximately 1,800 square kilometers southwest of Williams Lake, British Columbia. The Court also declared that British Columbia breached its duty to consult with the Tsilhqot'in Nation by issuing forestry licences and carrying out planning activities related to the removal of timber. This court decision, the first in Canadian history to formally recognize Aboriginal title, is not just a victory for the Tsilhqot'in people, who have been fighting for control of their traditional lands for more than 150 years, but a confirmation of the land rights promised to all First Nations since 1763.??
