?uu?atumin yaqck^wiimitqin (Doing it for our Ancestors) Alberni Indian Residential School Project (AIRS) has hired GeoScan to conduct Ground Penetrating Radar (GPR) and other appropriate scanning techniques and will begin their work in the former residential school area starting July 11, 2022, for two weeks. The company will be operating their machines over the area in various locations; please give them space to do their work.

We will ensure cultural protocol leads the work by consulting with our advisory support team. Scanning will be conducted with compassion and care as not to disrupt possible burial locations. We recognize this work may be difficult for our people and those who carry memories connected to AIRS. Together we are working to find answers from the past and bring truth to the present.

This part of the research is difficult but important work. Results from GPR will take time to analyze, process and will be summarized in a report. Those that are doing the scanning will not know the results or findings until the scanning results have been analyzed, and this process could take months to complete. Tseshaht will provide a statement to the appropriate audience down the road as more scanning may be required, this includes our members, those living near the research area, Survivors and Nations who had members attend AIRS.

We honor our ancestors by taking on this important work as a community to seek the answers that Survivors and those that did not make it home, need, and deserve.
