ċišaa?atḥ (Tseshaht) First Nation has over 1300 registered members whose ḥaḥuułi includes from the Somass watershed including the entire Alberni Valley, the western portions of both Horne Lake and Cameron Lake, the Alberni Inlet and surrounding lands and watersheds to the Broken Group Islands of central Barkley Sound, and out to the Pacific Ocean. Tseshaht possesses Aboriginal Rights within the ḥaḥuułi [ha-houl-thee] (traditional territory) owned by our tayii ḥawił [ty-ee ha-wil-th] (hereditary chief), including Aboriginal Title.
