OPEN LETTER FROM TSESHAHT FIRST NATION'S ELECTED CHIEF COUNCILLOR (WAHMEESH) KEN WATTS

To our brothers, sisters and relatives:

On behalf of cisaa?ath (Tseshaht) First Nation, I would like to offer our utmost honour, respect and support to Saahuus?ath (Ahousaht) First Nation, Survivors and the families whose children never made it home. The work being done by the ?ah?iihcp ?ukwił ?iqhmuut (Honouring Our Ancient Ones)

Residential Research Project team is a sacred responsibility for Survivors and the future of First Nations communities. However, we know the toll it can take on your hearts and minds. We stand with you during this challenging time.

Our Nations are connected through this tragic history. When fires occurred at the Alberni Indian Residential School (AIRS), students were moved to the Ahousaht Indian Residential School. There are many intermarriages between Tseshaht First Nation and Ahousaht First Nations members, creating a long-interconnected history. We also know many of our Nuu-chah-nulth peoples were sent to and transferred between these institutions and others across the province. It is through this work that we are able to establish these links and document our history to remember our ancestors and educate future generations.

We are sending our healing and loving prayers to our \aahuus ath brothers, sisters, leadership, staff and all Survivors of these institutions and those who never made it home.

For those impacted by the announcement made yesterday, please know that cultural and mental health support and resources are available. cišaa?atḥ (Tseshaht) First Nation will continue to create a safe space for AIRS Survivors, families and those affected by this news.
